

## Port Cover

- Close Port Cover after External Device Port use.

## Strap Eyelet


- Avoid metal Straps; may affect signal reception.

## Internal Antenna Areas

- Do not cover or place stickers/labels over Internal Antenna areas.

## Handset Keys

- Keys are indicated in this guide as shown in parentheses.
- Change assigned functions indicated \* with Set Key Shortcut.



## Parts & Functions

### 1 Outgoing History Key (☎)

Open Call Log (Dialed).

### 2 Bluetooth Key (📶)

Open Bluetooth menu. Long Press to reconnect paired devices\*.

### 3 Center Key (⬇)

Open Main Menu.

### 4 Incoming History Key (☎)

Open Call Log (Received). Long Press to open profile (My Details)\*.

### 5 Mail Key (✉)

Open Messaging menu. Long Press to open E-mail composition window\*.

### 6 Lock & A/a Key (🔒)

Open Speed Dial/Mail. Long Press to activate/cancel Keypad Lock.

### 7 Clear/Back Key (⌫)

Play Answer Phone messages. Long Press to activate/cancel Answer Phone.

### 8 Start Key (📍)

Open dial window. Long Press to send location information.

### 9 Dialpad (0-9, \*, #)

Enter numbers. Long Press to open Phone Book.

### 10 X Key (✕)

Enter ✕ and P. Long Press to activate/cancel Manner mode.

### 11 Web Key (🌐)

Open Browser menu. Long Press to activate Browser (access home page)\*.

### 12 Camera & Text Key (📷)

Activate Camera. Long Press to open Camera menu.

### 13 Phone Book Key (📞)

Open Phone Book. Long Press to open contact entry window\*.

### 14 Power Key (🔌)


Show/hide Softkeys; out of Standby, cancel operations. Long Press to power off.

### 15 # Key (#)

Enter #. Long Press to active/cancel Drive mode.

## Multi Selector

📶, 🌐, 📷, and ⬇ can also be used to select menu items, word/phrase (for text entry), etc.



- In this guide, some Multi Selector operations are indicated as follows.

⬇	Press 📶 or 🌐
📷	Press 📷 or ⬇
🌐	Press 📶, 🌐, 📷, or ⬇


## ■ Toggling View

When a menu/list extends off Display, press # or 🌐 for hidden items.

# Inserting & Removing Battery


If Battery is not inserted into handset, insert it as follows.

## 1 Remove Battery Cover





- Use notch to lift Battery Cover. Push up Battery Cover along edges to remove it.

## 2 Insert Battery



- With logo side facing up, align Battery terminals with contacts.

## 3 Replace Battery Cover




- Align dents on both sides of handset with Battery Cover tabs, then press down shaded areas of Battery Cover.

## 4 Confirm Battery Cover is closed properly

- If there is a gap between handset and Battery Cover, firmly press down Battery Cover.
- If Battery Cover is not closed properly, debris may get caught between gasket and base, allowing ingress of liquid/dust.

## Removing Battery

- Power off, remove Battery Cover, then lift Battery as shown.



## ■ Battery Cover Cautions

- Do not apply excessive force to Battery Cover; damage may result.
- To maintain water/dust resistance, close Battery Cover properly.
- If Battery Cover is damaged, replace it with a new one. Use of damaged Battery Cover may cause electric shock, battery corrosion, etc. due to water seepage.

## Inserting & Removing Battery

---

### ■ About Battery

- Charge Battery at least once every 6 months; uncharged Battery may die or affect files/settings.
- Depending on usage, bulges may appear near end of battery life; this does not affect safety.
- Replace Battery if operating time shortens noticeably.
- Clean Battery terminals and charging terminals with a dry cotton swab or the like.
- Battery is not water or dust proof.

### Lithium-ion Battery

- Handset requires a lithium-ion battery. Lithium-ion batteries are recyclable.
- To recycle a used lithium-ion battery, take it to any shop displaying the symbol to the right.
- To avoid fire or electric shock, do not short-circuit or disassemble Battery.



# Charging Battery

AC Charger is not included in the package; purchase **WILLCOM AC Charger 01 (AC01-MU-K)** separately.


- AC Charger is not water or dust proof. Do not charge Battery while handset is wet.
- Battery can also be charged by connecting handset to a PC.




## AC Charger Cautions

- Handset/AC Charger may become warm while charging.
- Retract blades after charging. Do not pull, bend or twist cable.
- Do not use commercial chargers that allow headphone use while charging; may cause malfunction.

- 1** Open Port Cover as shown




- 2** Insert Micro USB plug of AC Charger into External Device Port



- Insert Micro USB plug in correct orientation; otherwise, External Device Port may be damaged. Confirm contours and orientation of Micro USB plug before inserting it.


- 3** Extend blades and plug AC Charger into AC outlet



- Notification Lamp illuminates red while charging, and goes out when charge is full.

- 4** Unplug AC Charger and retract blades

- 5** Remove Micro USB plug from handset



- 6** Close Port Cover firmly

- Otherwise, debris may get caught between gasket and base, allowing ingress of liquid/dust.

# Power On/Off

## 1 (Long Press)

## 2 After a while...



- Standby appears.

### Powering Off

#### (Long Press)

- After Power Off Graphics, handset shuts down.

### ■ Display Saving

Display goes completely dark after Display Saving time elapses. Press any key (except  during a call) to turn on Display again.

#### Backlight

- Backlight turns off after Time Out period elapses. Press  -  to turn it back on (key press may affect active function).
- Display goes completely dark during a call. (Backlight does not turn off first.)

### Activating Keypad Lock

Prevent accidental operation such as when carrying handset in a bag or pocket.

## 1 (Long Press)

#### When Keypad Lock is Active

- Press  to answer calls; Keypad Lock reactivates after the call.
-  does not power handset off.

#### Canceling Keypad Lock

##### (Long Press)

- When Display is turned off, press any key to turn it back on, then cancel Keypad Lock.

# Display & Indicators

## Standby

Most operations start from Standby. Indicators appear at the top of Display.

## Information Window

Opens at the bottom for missed calls, new mail, etc.




- Information label (e.g., **Message**) and count appear. Select an item and press to open it.

## Softkeys

Functions/operations assigned to , , and appear at the bottom of Display.



### Submenus

- When **Options** appears, press corresponding key to open submenu for related functions/settings.



# Accessing Functions from Main Menu

- Main Menu opens.

Select menu item →



- Menu/window opens.
- If submenu opens, use  to select an item and press .

## Reverse Navigation

- Press . If confirmation appears, follow onscreen prompts.

## Returning to Standby

- Press . If confirmation appears, follow onscreen prompts.

## ■ Tabs

Menus/lists in a single window appear on separate tabs; use  to toggle tabs.

# Mobile Manners


Please use your handset responsibly. Take care not to disturb others when using handset.

- Power off in theaters, museums and other places where silence is the norm.
- Refrain from use in restaurants, hotel lobbies, elevators, etc.
- Observe signs and instructions regarding handset use aboard trains, buses, etc.
- Refrain from use that interrupts the flow of pedestrian or vehicle traffic.

## Manner Mode

Mute most handset function sounds.

- 1  (Long Press)



- Manner mode activates.

## When Manner Mode is Active

- Ringtones and other sounds are muted.
- Handset vibrates for incoming transmissions, etc.
- Camera shutter sound still plays at fixed volume.

## Canceling Manner Mode

- 1  (Long Press)

## Drive Mode

Disable ringtones and Vibration for incoming transmissions. The caller will be notified that you are driving and cannot answer.

- 1  (Long Press)



- Drive mode activates.

## Canceling Drive Mode

- 1  (Long Press)

## Offline Mode

Suspend signal transmission and reception.

- Handset will be unable to place/receive calls, send/receive messages, access the Internet, etc.

# Security Codes

These codes are required for handset use.

Handset Code	9999 by default; use or change some functions.
Administrator Code	9999 by default; required for Reset Settings and Reset All.

- Do not forget Security Codes.
- Do not reveal Security Codes. We are not liable for misuse or damages.

## Incorrect Code Entry

- Message appears for incorrect code entries; retry.

## Changing Handset Code


Enter 4 to 8 digits.



- Locks menu opens.




- Handset Code is 9999 by default.



## Need/UnNeed Setting

For enhanced security, set Need/UnNeed Setting to **Need**; then Handset Code will be required to delete all files/entries, etc.

# When Using Internet or Messaging for the First Time

If this is your first use of Internet or messaging, perform online sign-up to establish access to **WILLCOM** (WILLCOM's Internet connection point).

- Online sign-up also provides WILLCOM mail address.
- Transmission fees do not apply.

## Important Online Sign-up Notes

- Confirm signal strength before starting online sign-up.
- Online sign-up may be unavailable depending on your contract conditions.

# Using Handset by Connecting with Other Devices

## Smartphone Link

Connect handset with smartphones or other mobile phones via Bluetooth® to use their call functions on handset.

- For more about Bluetooth®, see P.9-6.
- To use call functions via Smartphone Link, see P.2-6.
- See description on the right to connect with smartphones, and see P.9-6 "Connecting Bluetooth® Devices" to connect with mobile phones and other devices.

### Supported Devices

- Handset supports connection with HFP (Bluetooth® profile) compatible devices. However, some HFP compatible devices may not support Smartphone Link.

## Connecting Smartphones

Use **Assign Smartphone** to easily connect with smartphones via Bluetooth®.

- Download **PHSかんたん登録** (application for Android 4.0 or later) from Google Play™ and install it on target smartphone beforehand.
- Some smartphones may not support **Assign Smartphone**. In this case, connect them following the procedure in "Connecting Bluetooth® Devices" (P.9-6 - P.9-7).

- QR code appears and handset Bluetooth® is enabled.
- When handset is connected with another Bluetooth® device, confirmation appears; select **Yes** and press  to disconnect it.

- If confirmation appears, follow onscreen instructions.

## Using Handset by Connecting with Other Devices

### Checking Connection with Smartphones

Check if handset is connected (paired) with target smartphone correctly.

- Bluetooth settings menu opens.

### Device List



- Bluetooth® connection (pairing) is complete if target smartphone's name is displayed with "connect" and  is at the top of Display.

### When "unused" is Displayed

In Bluetooth menu on smartphone, tap **WX03SH** in Paired devices field

- Connection to WX03SH starts;  
**Connected** appears upon completion.
